

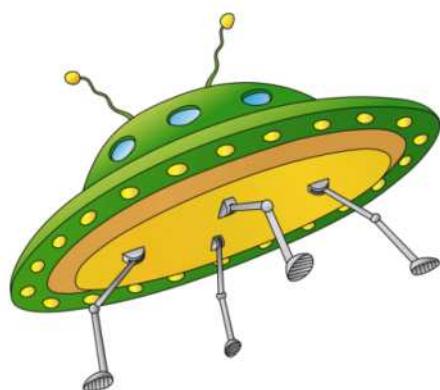


Planetary Rings

Most people know that Saturn has rings. But did you know that Saturn is not the only planet with rings? Uranus, Jupiter, and Neptune also have rings, although they are much harder to see.

These four planets each have a different number of rings in this puzzle: 4, 5, 8, or 13. Can you figure out how many rings each planet has and which one is the largest planet in our solar system?

1. Uranus is not the largest planet and does not have the fewest rings.
2. The largest planet does not have the greatest number of rings.
3. The second-largest planet has twice as many rings as the largest planet.
4. Saturn is not the largest of these four planets and has fewer rings than the third-largest planet.
5. The smallest planet has fewer rings than Saturn but more than Jupiter.
6. Neptune has fewer rings than Uranus.
